Interpretation Guide

Becoming a Pharmacy Technician in Newfoundland and Labrador

Pharmacy Technicians Already Registered in Another Canadian Jurisdiction

In order to register as a pharmacy technician in Newfoundland and Labrador, candidates registered in another province must:

- First**, submit a completed “Application for Registration as a Pharmacy Technician” form, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that these documents do not necessarily have to be submitted at the same time as the form but your registration will not be completed until they are all received:
 - A Letter of Standing from all pharmacy regulatory authorities with which you are currently, or were formerly, registered, indicating:
 - the period of time you were registered with that organization,
 - your current status with that organization,
 - whether or not you have been suspended or restricted with respect to the practice of pharmacy by that organization, and
 - confirmation that you have complied with any professional development or competency requirements of that organization
 - Verification from your employer(s) that you have practiced as a pharmacy technician for a minimum of 420 hours in the previous two calendar years.
 - A current “Certificate of Conduct” from a police agency, issued within the past six months

PLEASE NOTE: Prior to continuing your registration, your application will be evaluated to ensure that you have met all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador. In particular, depending on where you have been practicing, you may be required to demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with the NLPB’s *English Language Proficiency Requirements for Registration**.

- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination as outlined in the NLPB’s *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide**.
- Submit final documentation including:
 - Proof of professional liability insurance coverage, in accordance with the NLPB’s *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration**.
