## *Interpretation Guide*

### Becoming a Pharmacy Technician in Newfoundland and Labrador

#### New Graduates of Accredited Canadian Pharmacy Technician Programs

In order to register as a pharmacy technician in Newfoundland and Labrador, candidates from a CCAPP-accredited program must:

- First**, submit a completed “Application for Registration as a Pharmacy Technician” form, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that these documents do not necessarily have to be submitted at the same time as the form but your registration will not be completed until they are all received:
  - An official transcript or original diploma indicating graduation from a pharmacy technician educational program accredited by the Canadian Council for the Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs (CCAPP)
  - A current “Certificate of Conduct” from a police agency, issued within the past six months

**PLEASE NOTE:** Prior to continuing your registration, your application will be evaluated to ensure that you have met all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador. In particular, depending on where you completed your education, you may be required to demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with the NLPB’s *English Language Proficiency Requirements for Registration*\*.

- Successfully complete a practical training period, and submit all required documentation, as outlined in the NLPB’s *Practical Training Requirements for Registration as a Pharmacy Technician*\*.
- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination as outlined in the NLPB’s *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide*\*.
- Successfully complete Parts I and II of the PEBC Pharmacy Technician Qualifying Examination ([www.pebc.ca](http://www.pebc.ca)).
- Submit final documentation including:
  - Proof of professional liability insurance coverage, in accordance with the NLPB’s *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration*\*.
