Interpretation Guide

Becoming a Pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador New Graduates of Memorial University of Newfoundland

In order to register as a pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador, you must:

- Successfully complete a practice experience period, and submit all required documentation, as outlined in the NLPB's *Practice Experience Requirements for Registration as a Pharmacist**.
- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination as outlined in the NLPB's *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide**.
- Successfully complete Parts I and II of the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) Qualifying Examination (www.pebc.ca)
- Submit a completed "Application for Registration as a Pharmacist" form*, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that these documents do not necessarily have to be submitted at the same time as the form but your registration will not be completed until they are all received:
 - An official MUN transcript or original diploma indicating graduation
 - A current "Certificate of Conduct" from a police agency, issued within the past six (6) months
 - Proof of professional liability insurance coverage, in accordance with the NLPB's *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration**.
 - Proof of membership in the Pharmacists' Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, as required by section 21(3)(a) of the *Pharmacy Act, 2012*

Enabling Legislation: Pharmacy Act, 2012 section 14.
