Interpretation Guide

Becoming a Pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador

New Graduates of Other Accredited Canadian Universities

In order to register as a pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador, you must:

- First** submit a completed “Application for Registration as a Pharmacist” form*, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that these documents do not necessarily have to be submitted at the same time as the form but your registration will not be completed until they are all received.
 - An official transcript or original diploma indicating graduation from a Faculty of Pharmacy accredited by the Canadian Council for the Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs (CCAPP)
 - A current “Certificate of Conduct” from a police agency, issued within the past six (6) months
 - A Letter of Standing from the pharmacy regulatory authority in any province in which you have completed a structured practice experience (SPE) period, indicating:
 - when the SPE was completed (specific dates must be given),
 - the location (pharmacy or site name) at which the SPE was completed, and
 - the name of the preceptor for the SPE

PLEASE NOTE: Prior to continuing your registration, your application will be evaluated to ensure that you have met all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador. In particular, depending on where you completed your pharmacy program, you may be required to:

- demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with the NLPB’s *English Language Proficiency Requirements for Registration** or
- complete an additional practice experience period, in accordance with the NLPB’s *Practice Experience Requirements for Registration as a Pharmacist**

- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination, as outlined in the NLPB’s *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide**
- Successfully complete Parts I and II of the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) Qualifying Examination (www.pebc.ca)
- Submit final documentation including:
 - Proof of professional liability insurance coverage, in accordance with the NLPB’s *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration**
 - Proof of membership in the Pharmacists’ Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, as required by section 21(3)(a) of the *Pharmacy Act, 2012*.
