| | The applicant must register as a Pharmacy Intern and successfully complete practical training, in accordance with NLPB's <i>Practical Training Requirements for Registration as a Pharmacist.</i> | | |
| | The applicant must apply for and successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination in accordance with NLPB's <i>Registration Examination Interpretation Guide</i> . | | |
| | The applicant must successfully complete both Parts I and II of the Pharmacy Examining Board of Canada (PEBC) Qualifying Examination for Pharmacists. | | |
| | The applicant must provide a certificate of conduct, in accordance with NLPB's Certificate of Conduct Requirements for Registration. | | |
| | The applicant must arrange to have an official transcript indicating graduation sent from the University where they completed their pharmacy program directly to NLPB. Alternatively, a notarized copy of the applicant's diploma may be mailed or hand-delivered to the NLPB office. | | |
| | The applicant must submit a completed "Application for Registration as a Pharmacist", along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents ¹ including: | | |
| | | professional liability insurance coverage certificate, indicating current coverage in accordance ith NLPB's <i>Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration;</i> | |
| | | overnment-issued photo identification in accordance with NLPB's <i>Photo Identification</i> equirements for Registration; and | |

| Once the above steps have been completed and all documentation has been received, the applicant's file will be reviewed to ensure that all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador have been met. The applicant will be notified once a final decision has been made. | | | |
