Interpretation Guide

Becoming a Pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador

Pharmacists Registered in Another Canadian Jurisdiction¹

In order to register as a pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador, you must:

- Submit a completed “Application for Registration as a Pharmacist”, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that your registration application will not be reviewed until all documents are received.
 - A current “Certificate of Conduct”, from the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or another appropriate agency, issued within the past six months
 - Letters of Standing from all pharmacy regulatory authorities with which you are currently, or were formerly, registered, indicating:
 - the period of time you were registered with that organization,
 - your current status with that organization,
 - whether or not you have been suspended or restricted with respect to the practice of pharmacy by that organization,
 - confirmation that you have complied with any professional development or competency requirements of that organization, and
 - whether or not you are authorized to perform/participate in any expanded scopes of practice
 - A professional liability insurance coverage certificate, indicating current coverage in accordance with NLPB’s *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration*
 - Government-issued photo identification in accordance with NLPB’s *Photo Identification Requirements for Registration*
 - Proof of membership in the Pharmacists’ Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, as required by section 21(3)(a) of the *Pharmacy Act, 2012*

- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination as outlined in NLPB’s *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide*.

PLEASE NOTE: Before your registration is completed, your application will be reviewed to ensure that you have met all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador including English language proficiency. Depending on where you have been practicing, you may be required to further demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with NLPB’s *English Language Proficiency Requirements for Registration*.
