Interpretation Guide

Becoming a Pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador Pharmacists Already Registered in Another Canadian Jurisdiction

In order to register as a pharmacist in Newfoundland and Labrador, you must:

- First** submit a completed “Application for Registration as a Pharmacist”, along with the appropriate fee and supporting documents. Please note that these documents do not necessarily have to be submitted at the same time as the application but your registration will not be completed until they are all received.
 - A current “Certificate of Conduct”, issued within the past six months
 - A Letter of Standing from all pharmacy regulatory authorities with which you are currently, or were formerly, registered, indicating:
 - the period of time you were registered with that organization,
 - your current status with that organization,
 - whether or not you have been suspended or restricted with respect to the practice of pharmacy by that organization,
 - whether or not you are authorized to perform/participate in any expanded scopes of practice, and
 - confirmation that you have complied with any professional development or competency requirements of that organization
 - Verification from your employer(s) that you have practiced as a pharmacist for a minimum of 420 hours in the previous two calendar years

PLEASE NOTE: Prior to continuing your registration, your application will be evaluated to ensure that you have met all requirements for registration in Newfoundland and Labrador. In particular, depending on where you have been practicing, you may be required to demonstrate English language proficiency in accordance with NLPB’s *English Language Proficiency Requirements for Registration*

- Successfully complete the NLPB Registration Examination as outlined in NLPB’s *Registration Examination Interpretation Guide*.
- Submit final documentation including:
 - Copy of current professional liability insurance coverage certificate, in accordance with NLPB’s *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration*
 - Proof of membership in the Pharmacists’ Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, as required by section 21(3)(a) of the *Pharmacy Act, 2012*
