



# Newfoundland and Labrador Pharmacy Board

## *Interpretation Guide*

### Requirements for Re-Registration in Newfoundland and Labrador

In accordance with the *Pharmacy Regulations, 2014*, registrants who were previously registered with the NLPB but have let their registration lapse for one reason or another (medical leave, parental leave, etc.) may be re-registered upon meeting the following conditions:

- a) If registration has been lapsed for less than two years, he or she must:
  - i) Submit a completed "Application for Registration", along with the appropriate fee;
  - ii) Provide proof of professional liability insurance coverage, in accordance with the NLPB's "Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration";
  - iii) Provide proof of completion of a minimum of 15 CEU credits, at least half of which must be from accredited programs.
  - iv) For pharmacists - provide proof of membership in the Pharmacists' Association of Newfoundland and Labrador, as required by section 21(3)(a) of the *Pharmacy Act, 2012*; and
- b) If registration has been lapsed for more than two years, but less than five years, in addition to the requirements in a) above, he or she must also:
  - i) Successfully complete one month of supervised practical training for each year or part year, beyond one year, that the registrant has been out of practice, to a maximum of eight months; and
  - ii) Successfully re-write the NLPB Registration Examination.
- c) If registration has been lapsed for more than five years, in addition to the requirements in a) and b) above, he or she must also:
  - i) Successfully complete Part II of the appropriate PEBC Qualifying Examination.

The Board retains the authority to consider each individual application for re-registration on its own merits and to exercise discretion in setting additional conditions of that applicant, based on the individual particulars of that application.
