Interpretation Guide

Registration as a Pharmacy Intern

- 1) In accordance with the *Pharmacy Act, 2012* and the *Pharmacy Regulations, 2014*, a person may be registered with the board as a pharmacy intern where he or she:
 - a) applies in a manner and form prescribed by the board;
 - b) provides proof satisfactory to the board that he or she has graduated from a Faculty of Pharmacy accredited by the Canadian Council for the Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs or another accreditation body approved by the board;
 - c) provides a current certificate of conduct (issued within the past six months) from the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or other appropriate policing agency;
 - d) provides proof that he or she has obtained professional liability insurance coverage in accordance with the NLPB's *Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration**;
 - e) provides photo identification acceptable to the board; and
 - f) pays the fees set by the board as well as any outstanding fines or penalties which are owed to the board.

- 2) In addition, **Pharmacy Interns are reminded:**
 - a) Registration as a pharmacy intern is valid for the period of time specified in the certificate of registration. It is not subject to renewal but may be extended, as necessary.
 - b) Pharmacy interns shall identify themselves as a pharmacy intern when communicating or working with the public or members of the pharmacy profession.
 - c) Registration of a pharmacy intern confers upon the intern the right to perform tasks within the scope of practice of a pharmacist, but only under the supervision of a pharmacist in accordance with the standards of practice.
 - d) A pharmacy intern shall only practice pharmacy where he or she is supervised, in a manner acceptable to the board, by a registered pharmacist whose registration is not subject to conditions or restrictions.
