Interpretation Guide

Registration as a Pharmacy Student

- 1) In accordance with the *Pharmacy Act, 2012* and the *Pharmacy Regulations, 2014*, pharmacy students may be registered with the Board where he or she:
 - a) applies in a manner and form prescribed by the board on or before September 30th of each academic year;
 - b) provides proof satisfactory to the board that he or she is enrolled in a Faculty of Pharmacy accredited by the Canadian Council for the Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs or another accreditation body approved by the board;
 - c) provides a current certificate of conduct (issued within the past six months) from the Royal Newfoundland Constabulary, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police or other appropriate policing agency;

PLEASE NOTE: This certificate of conduct is only required upon initial registration.

- d) provides proof that he or she has obtained professional liability insurance coverage in accordance with "Professional Liability Insurance Requirements for Registration";
 - e) provides photo identification acceptable to the board; and
 - f) pays the fees set by the board as well as any outstanding fines or penalties which are owed to the board.
- 2) In addition, **Pharmacy Students are reminded:**
 - a) Registration of a student confers upon the student the right to perform tasks within the scope of practice of a pharmacist, but only under the direct supervision of a pharmacist.
 - b) Only a registered pharmacy student enrolled in a course of study in a Faculty of Pharmacy accredited by the Canadian Council for the Accreditation of Pharmacy Programs or another accreditation body approved by the board may identify himself or herself as a pharmacy student.
 - c) Practical experience placements shall only be completed by students registered with the board.
 - d) A pharmacy student shall identify himself or herself as a student when communicating or working with the public or members of the pharmacy profession.
 - e) A pharmacy student shall only practice pharmacy where he or she is supervised, in a manner acceptable to the board, by a registered pharmacist whose registration is not subject to conditions or restrictions.
